- Randolph Mantooth, Actor/Screenwriter/Producer/Speaker "Johnny Gage" from the 1970s hit TV show Emergency! Don't miss Randy's perspective on the pioneers who created the first paramedic programs in the United States and his inside look at the television series credited with helping advance ALS systems across the nation in the 1970s. He'll be on hand the whole week and wrap up the conference Wednesday, Sept. 15. He'll also host a bit of nostalgia in "Dinner with Johnny Gage" Monday night, Sept. 13.
