### Required Equipment:

- Wrap-around Eye Protection
- Ear protection (electronic preferred)
- Baseball style hat
- Duty belt/patrol pistol belt
- Range food / WATER
- Seasonal weather gear/rain gear
- Duty handgun, preferably 12-round capacity or higher
- Single stack .45s are fine; increase the magazine count to 8 minimum
- 1000 rounds of factory ammunition
- Cleaning kit/lubrication
- NOTE-TAKING MATERIALS

Holsters MUST be capable of holstering without the use of the support hand.

Old leather pancake style or inside the waistband holsters that do not retain their opening

Shoulder rigs ARE NOT permitted \*\*
